FBC is ready to receive human health concerns relating to oil and gas development in Northeastern BC

Vancouver – The Fraser Basin Council (FBC) has begun the first phase of a three-phase human health risk assessment in northeastern British Columbia to identify any human health concerns that people may have about oil and gas development in the region. FBC is carrying out Phase 1 of the human health risk assessment for the BC Ministry of Health. Phase 1 will inform the Ministry’s terms of reference for Phase 2, an assessment of health risks.

During Phase 1, the Fraser Basin Council is inviting comments from multiple interests, including members of the public who live and work in northeastern BC, citizens groups, government authorities, health organizations, environmental organizations, community groups, industry, workers, academic institutions, and anyone else who may be able to identify human health concerns.

“In Phase 1 of the Human Health Risk Assessment, we are finding out what health concerns exist about oil and gas development in BC’s northeast,” said David Marshall, Executive Director of the Fraser Basin Council. “To do that, we plan to connect with a range of interests in the region, and we want everyone with a concern to express to know they are welcome to participate.”

FBC is also scheduling a number of one-on-one meetings with individuals or organizations in the region, by telephone or in person. A request for a one-on-one meeting can be made by email (info@hhra.ca) or telephone (1-855-664-4472).

FBC will create a synopsis of human health concerns in a Phase 1 report. That report will be delivered to the Province of BC at the end of March, and will subsequently be made public.

About the Human Health Risk Assessment

The Human Health Risk Assessment is a three-phase project organized by the BC Ministry of Health to identify, explore and assess concerns about human health relating to oil and gas development in Northeastern British Columbia. The full risk assessment consists of three phases: 1) a public engagement to identify health concerns, 2) a human health risk assessment based on findings from Phase 1 and 3) a report to the Province, stakeholders and the public.
