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PROJECT OVERVIEW

Abstract

The research objectives of the Open Burning Practices and Policy Options Study for the Fraser Valley Regional District (FVRD) were:

- 1. Assess the current open burning situation in the FVRD
- 2. Assess the impact of open burning on air quality in the FVRD
- 3. Review of existing open burning policies
- 4. Proposed solutions to reducing open burning in the FVRD

SNC-Lavalin was retained by the FVRD for these purposes. They conducted a series of interviews, data assessments, and case study analyses to conclude with the project's final report (Appendix 1).

Open burning was found to constitute as much as 7% of the total particulate matter (PM) loading to the region, but could be higher due to some data limitations. This represents a significant portion of the PM within the region, which is a substantial health and environmental concern.

Consultant recommendations to address these concerns included identification of a consistent burn period across municipalities, restricting open burning on properties smaller than one hectare, developing an open burning best management practices guidance document for landowners, development of an open burning bylaw that would apply to the region's electoral areas, and to conduct a feasibility study for looking at viable alternatives that may be offered within the region (e.g., wood drop off programs). Acting on these recommendations is the primary intent of the next phase of this project, which has tentatively been approved for additional BC Clear funding.
