- Resource sharing

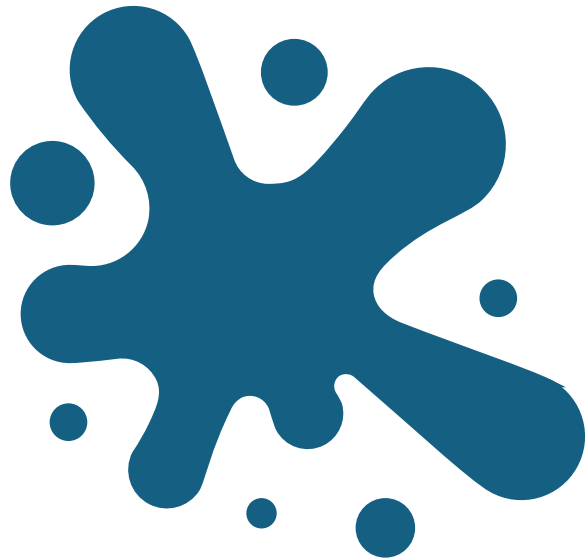
