The Fraser Basin Council (FBC) brings people together to advance sustainability in British Columbia. Established in 1997, FBC is a charitable non-profit society led by a 38-member board of directors who come from the four orders of government (federal, provincial, local and First Nations), along with people from the private sector and civil society.

Over the past 25 years, FBC has delivered on a wide variety of collaborative initiatives to help people learn about sustainability, resolve conflicts and explore and advance sustainability practices and solutions. As our name suggests, our work has traditionally focused on the communities and watersheds of the Fraser Basin – but we work in other communities also, and many of our initiatives serve all of BC.
